Need to browse books on a subject? Use the Dewey Decimal System:

000– Computer Science, information , and general works
100- Philosophy & psychology
200– Religion
300– Social Sciences
400– Language
500– Science
600– Technology
700– Arts & recreation
800- Literature
900– History & geography

Need something more specific? Use the computers marked “Library Catalog” to search:

Start with a subject search, click on the title of the book you want, and write down the call number. Books are shelved in order by the call number located on the spine of the book.

Search the library’s catalog 24/7 at www.lincolnlibraries.org



How to find it:

Databases

Websites

To find a book using the library catalog:

- Find a computer labeled Library Catalog
- Type in a subject/topic and hit enter
- Click on the title
- Locate and write down the call number
- Check to see if the location says Eiseley
- Check to see if the status says Checked In
- Find the book on the shelf by locating the number on the spine

To use the databases:

- Go to the library's homepage at www.lincolnlibraries.org
- Choose the Research Tools, Research Resources (Databases) from the yellow menu on the left side
- If you are working from a computer outside of the library, type in your library card number when prompted.

Need an article from a magazine or scholarly journal?

Use EBSCO Masterfile Premier:
Log on, type in a keyword, check the box that says full text, and click search. Discover a list of articles related to your topic with full text and citation information.

Need information about another country?

Use Kids InfoBits:
Log on, select Geography, choose a country, and find out about their flag, their people, their culture, and statistics.

Need to study for a test?

Use Testing & Education Reference Center:
Log on, create a free account, then choose the test and answer the practice questions to find your time and score.

Can't find the answer you need?

Log on, ask a question, and find direction to information to answer your toughest questions.
